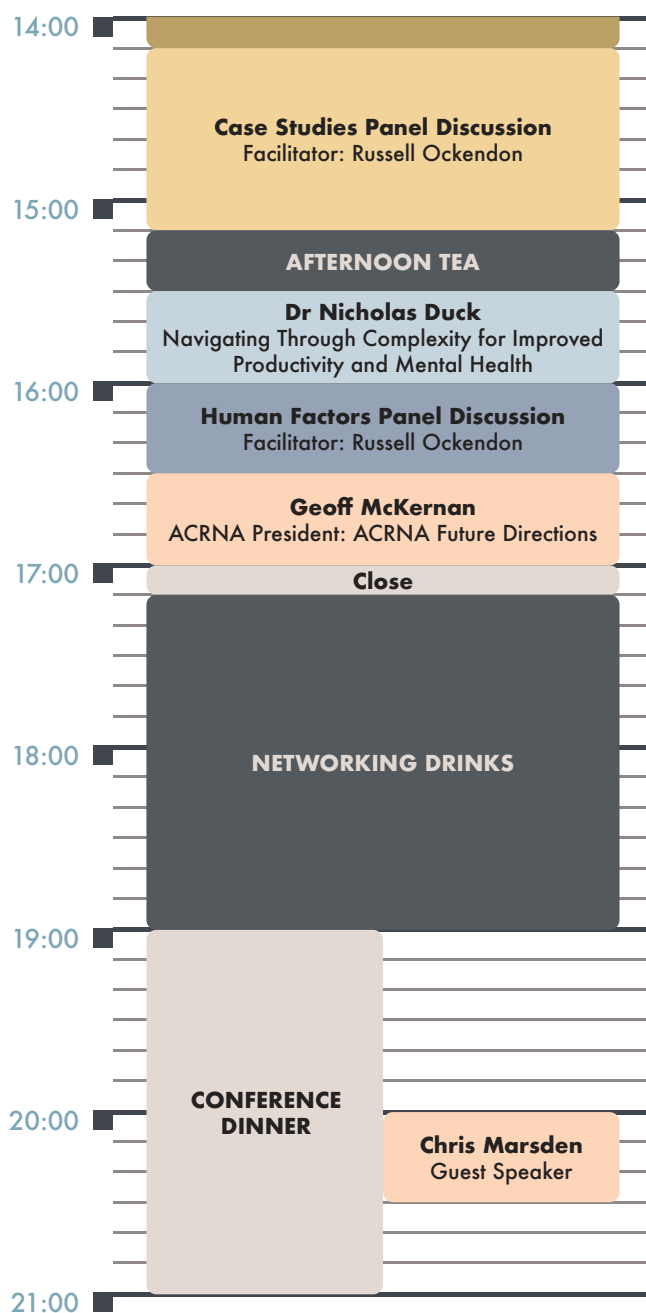
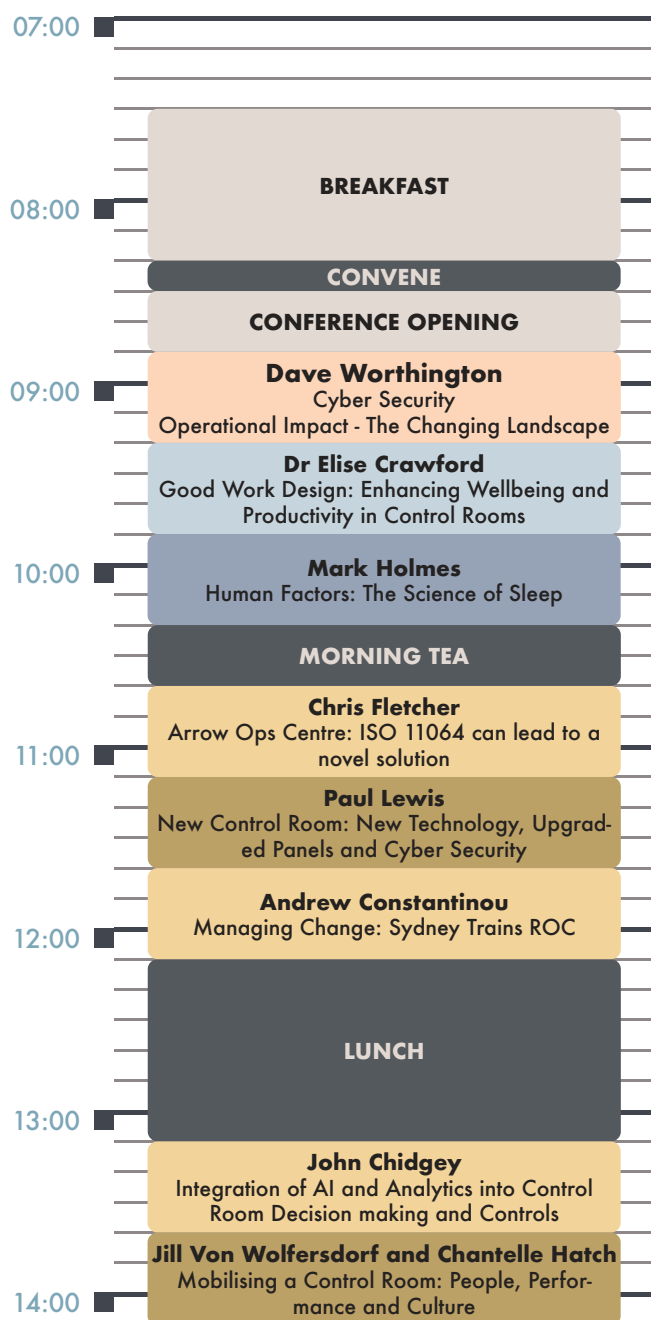

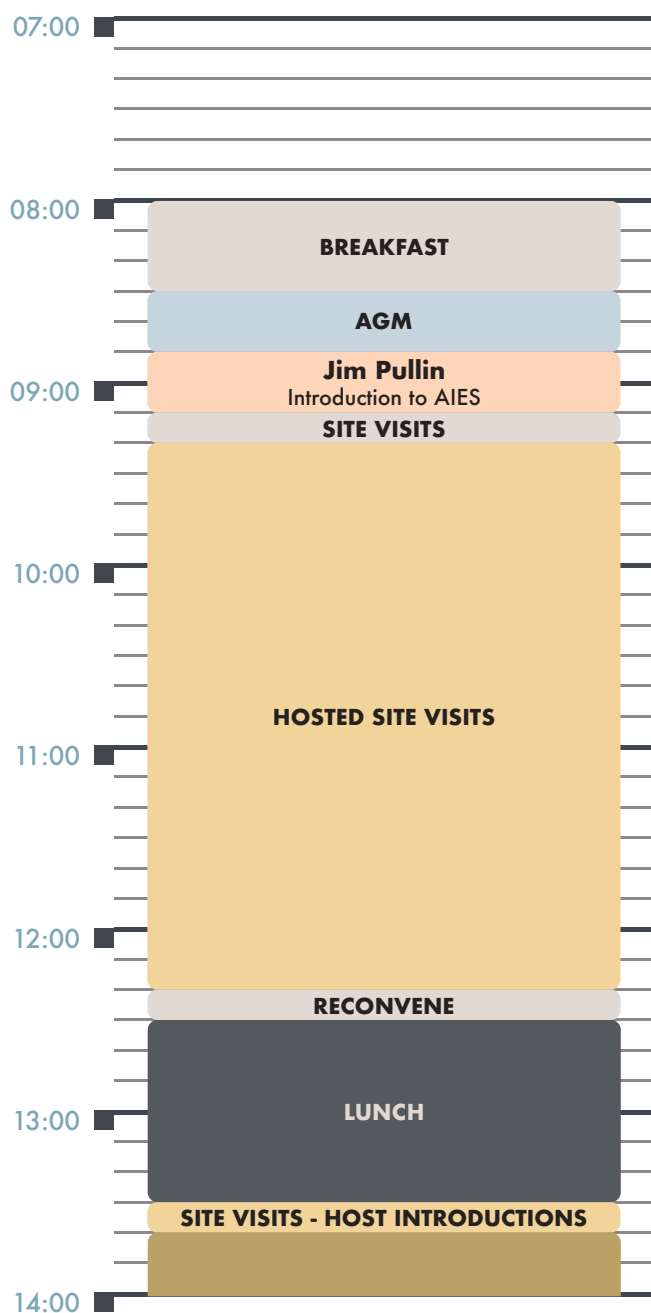

Chris Marsden, Public Servant, Retired



Chris Marsden retired in mid 2021 after nearly 40 years in the Australian Public Service and the South Australian Public Service. A self-described reluctant public servant, worked in numerous agencies in Adelaide, his home town, and in Canberra. Of relevance for this conference, from 2006 to 2012, Chris was the Director, Critical Infrastructure Security within the Department of Broadband, Communications and the Digital Economy and responsible for managing the Secretariat for three industry government groups – the Communications Sector Group, the IT Security Expert Advisory Group and the SCADA Community of Interest.

In 2013, Chris joined the Department of Resources, Energy and Tourism. For the following five years, Chris chaired the National Gas Emergency Response Advisory Committee, provided secretariat to the Energy Sector Group and was the Commonwealth representative on the National Electricity Market's Emergency Management Forum.
